C. Kings-Sequoia Gateway FireSafe & Stewardship Program w/OTFSC (I)

Staff

Almost hit the deliverables on the Fire Risk Evaluations within one year of a two year program. Hired Susana Ward as a forestry field assistant to support the program. The SRCD team launched the Fire Defense Program within this grant to pay for landowners to get defensible space cleared on their properties, as selected through the OTFSC as it ties into their current programs, and after they receive a FRE or a Fire Defense Evaluation. This part of the program is being led by Ian Ashby, SRCD Forestry Field Assistant and Safety Officer.

D. CARCD / NRCS Tree Mortality, NRCS Post-Disaster TA & MOA (I)

There were about 18-20 NRCS contracts awarded in forestry through Fresno County.

E. DOC – Southern Sierra Forest Health Watershed Program (I)

The CA Dept of Water Resources for meadow restoration is not in the construction phase, all the permitting has been permitted. \$ meadows is to be restored, Sierra RCD is the fiscal agent and grant management support.

Community Water Systems was kicked off with Big Sandy Rancheria and sampled two wells, and was sent to Lawrence Livermore labs and BSK labs.

A. NRCS Report – Fresno County RCDs Local Work Group – 10/8 @ Farm Bureau Johnnie Siliznoff, DC

The Sierra RCD for their assistance, the NRCs in Fresno Co awarded 235 contracts and 3 ore this week, 238 contracts and a minimum of 11.87 million dollars, with 7 planners. Can see where Justin is going to be a large asset to the NRCS and other people as well. The largest projects were air pollution, cropland, cover crops, and forestry. CIC included 31 contracts, 1.5 million in historically underserved. The local workgroup Oct 8th 1-3:#0 for all RCD Directors to take part in person or remotely, the RCDs will be talking about the RCD concerns in the County. Anything that you want to know about NRCS and have a presentation on UCCE on soil health. Presentation from Karen Burr from CARCD, Sierra to the Slew presentation, and some on cover crops and habitat planting.
